Community First Cooperative Credit Union: A Legacy of Excellence

History and Evolution: Founded in 1959 as the Antigua and Barbuda Teachers Co-operative Credit Union, this financial institution has undergone a transformative journey over the decades. The initial objective, under the leadership of Mr. Charles Sampson and a dedicated group of teachers, was to establish a financial savings co-operative tailored to the needs of educators and their families. However, it wasn't until January 18, 1982, following the appointment of a full-time Registrar of Co-operative Societies in 1980, that the Antigua and Barbuda Teachers Credit Union was officially registered.

Recognizing the potential limitations of a closed bond credit union, the institution underwent a crucial evolution in 1989. A decision was made to broaden its bond, opening membership to include nurses, civil servants, and other professionals. This strategic move aimed at fostering a greater pooling of financial resources and ensuring the credit union's future sustainability.

By 2001, the credit union had experienced a significant shift. The open bond policy had diversified the membership base, with teachers constituting only 30% compared to the 70% share they held in 1991. In response to this change, the credit union made a decision to rebrand itself, aligning with its newfound identity as a financial institution serving a broader community. The Antigua and Barbuda Teachers Co-operative Credit Union became the Community First Co-operative Credit Union (CFCCU), reflecting the organization's commitment to bringing the community closer together. The name change, as reassured by then-President Mr. Vier Dublin, did not signify a departure from the core philosophy but rather an evolution in alignment with the evolving community it served.
