CARICOM, founded on July 4, 1973, is a regional organization comprising 15 Caribbean countries and dependencies. Its primary objective is to promote economic integration, cooperation, and collective action among its member states. CARICOM's headquarters are located in Georgetown, Guyana, and its decision-making body is the Conference of Heads of Government.



Its guiding principles are as follows: -

Unity and Solidarity: CARICOM seeks to foster a sense of unity and solidarity among its member states, recognizing that they share common historical, social, economic, and cultural ties.

Economic Integration: The community aims to establish a single market and economy, facilitating the free movement of goods, services, labor, and capital within the region.

ECCB Governor visits Antigua and Barbuda for Country Outreach Mission

The Governor of the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank (ECCB), Timothy N. J. Antoine, and his delegation recently embarked on a series of Country Outreach Missions, with their most recent stop being in the beautiful twinisland nation of Antigua and Barbuda. This visit aimed to engage with various Social Partners and address critical issues affecting the nation's economy and its citizens.

On 15 June, the ECCB delegation had the opportunity to meet and interact with an array of stakeholders, including legislators, bankers, civil society, labor unions, churches, and youth organizations. Additionally, they also engaged with members of the Chamber of Industry and Commerce, further ensuring a comprehensive understanding of the concerns and perspectives of different sectors of society.

Fortifying Your Finances: Unmasking Cybersecurity Threats and Shielding Yourself

In today's interconnected digital landscape, safeguarding our financial data has become more critical than ever. Cybercriminals employ various tactics to exploit vulnerabilities and gain unauthorized access to sensitive information. ATM Skimming: Criminals install devices on ATMs to capture card information and PINs. This information is then used to create counterfeit cards or make unauthorized transactions.

Social Engineering: This technique manipulates individuals into revealing confidential information through psychological manipulation or deception. It often involves impersonating a trusted entity, such as a bank representative or customer service agent.

Cybersecurity Threats – How to Protect Yourself

Be Vigilant: Exercise caution when interacting with emails, messages, or websites. Look for signs of phishing, such as grammatical errors, generic greetings, or suspicious URLs. Avoid clicking on unsolicited links or providing personal information unless you verify the source.

Strengthen Passwords: Create strong, unique passwords for each online account. Include a combination of uppercase and lowercase letters, numbers, and symbols. Consider using a password manager to securely store and generate complex passwords.

Keep Software Updated: Regularly update your operating system, web browsers, and antivirus software to patch security vulnerabilities and protect against known threats.



Enable Two-Factor Authentication (2FA): Enable 2FA whenever possible, as it adds an extra layer of security by requiring a second verification step, such as a unique code sent to your mobile device.

Protect Personal Information: Be cautious about sharing personal data online. Avoid providing sensitive information unless it is necessary, and you trust the recipient. Regularly monitor your financial accounts for any suspicious activity.
